## Attention All Unincorporated Vernon Township Residents

Please be advised that Vernon Township has an ordinance regarding the height of grass and weeds on your property. The ordinance states every owner of land in the unincorporated area of Vernon Township, which is within fifty yards of any occupied residence in the township, is required to keep their grass or weeds below six inches in height.

## "File Of Life" Cards Still Available

The File of Life© is a card containing important medical information essential to those responding to an emergency situation. There is a large card, which slips into a magnetized bright red pocket for prominent display on your refrigerator and ready accessibility to EMTs. A smaller one, for carrying in your wallet or purse, can assist hospital emergency staff. The cards contain space for emergency contacts, doctors' names, medical conditions, medications, surgeries, allergies, medical insurance information, etc. Vernon Township is pleased to be offering them free of charge to our residents. # The Raupp Report

## Attention Seniors

### *Don't miss out on potential property tax savings!*

It surprises our office just how many times a senior comes in to apply for a senior exemption and they missed out for a few years because they didn't know about it.

If you are the owner of a residential property and are 65 years or older, you can qualify for a Senior Homestead Exemption. For new homeowners starting in the tax year 2003, a law was passed prorating the Senior Homestead Exemption. It no longer is required that you have lived there as of January 1<sup>st</sup>, however, if you have claimed the exemption on another property, it will remain on that property for that year, and you will receive it on your new property the following year.

New for the 2006 tax year is an increase in the senior exemption amount. The exemption increased from \$3,000 to \$3,500 for the tax year 2006 payable in 2007. The Senior Homestead Exemption lowers your equalized assessed value

\$3,500 in addition to the \$5,000 Homestead Limited Exemption for a total of \$8,500. To calculate the exact amount you will receive off your tax bill, you multiply the total exemption amounts by the tax rate for that year. Senior Homestead Exemption applications are prepared at the Township Assessor's Office. If you call ahead of time, the Assessors office staff can get the application started. Proof of age, usually a driver's license and a copy of your deed, is a requirement for this exemption. If your property is in a trust, a copy of the trust agreement is also needed. Starting for the tax year 2004 seniors are NO LONGER required to renew this exemption.

Do **not** confuse the Senior Homestead Exemption with the Senior Freeze forms. The Senior Freeze forms are required to be completed every year based on your household income. These forms are usually mailed between May and June from the county office. If you have any questions, please call (847) 634-4602

## Exemptions at a glance:

- General Homestead Exemption is automatic and is \$5,000
- Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption is an additional \$3,500
- Senior Citizen Assessment Freeze-to be eligible maximum total household income is \$50,000

Homestead Improvement Exemption is automatic when a permit is taken out for an improvement that adds to the assessment. This exemption is a four-year exemption. The first \$75,000 market (\$25,000 assessed) will not be tallied on the tax bill for four years.

## Deeds

Please be aware, there are companies sending letters to residents offering a certified copy of your deed for a cost. One company requires a fee of \$75.00 plus an extra \$4.50 postage and handling fee. You can obtain this document yourself from the county for a more reasonable fee. ## Spring Clean Up

## Save the Rain for a Sunny Day

A rain barrel connected to your downspout is a great way to keep stormwater out of the system and to cut down on your water bill. Because you are collecting right off the roof, it has few contaminants and is perfect for watering the garden.

Diverting water from your downspout into a rainwater catchment system has several advantages:

- Reduces the volume of water flowing to the sewer treatment facility
- Backup source of water during times of drought or between rain showers
- Helps to keep our creeks and beaches clean
- Naturally softened water-great for delicate houseplants, auto cleaning and window washing
- Saves money lowering your water bill
- Reduces the need for additional tax dollars earmarked for sewer expansion
- Chlorine-free water helps maintain a healthy biotic community in the soil

## A Bit of Vernon Township History

In October 1980 officials from Rubicon Productions, an Evanston-based film company, contacted Vernon Township Supervisor William Peterson. The film company was looking for a rural-looking cemetery and a Victorian-style house for a film that was being directed by Joanne Woodward and starring Estelle Parson. He directed them to the Vernon Cemetery and one of the Victorian houses across from the Prairie View train station on Main Street. In December of that same year, Mr. Peterson, his family, the township clerk, and several other area residents appeared in the made-for-television movie entitled "Come Along With Me."

During that time the Chicago area had become a major center for commercial and industrial films, many of the area residents were active in the industry. Jim Miller, of Lincolnshire, handled all the lighting; Drew Carlson, the assistant director, grew up in Libertyville; Ralph Hall, the art director, lived in Long Grove; the camera crane came from Buffalo Grove and the trustee of Vernon Township, Dave Weiland supplied the flowers. Rumor has it that Paul Newman was also involved in the production, he was seen walking around at the various locations asking questions about the location.

### Two forms of identification are required to register through a deputy registrar:

- At least one of the two forms must show your name and current address,
- Only one form of identification may be a piece of mail for a contractual service addressed and delivered to you

*If you have moved since the last election, changed your name or turned 18 years old you will need to register.*

### You may register to vote:

- At the County Clerk's office, 18 North County St., Waukegan
- Through a Deputy Registrar appointed by the County Clerk
- At your local municipal or township office and other local agencies

# Vernon Township Pool Information

Any person wishing to enjoy the Vernon Township Aquatics Facility must have a valid season pass or purchase a daily pass at the pool registration desk. To be eligible for resident rates, you must provide proof of your Vernon Township residency with a valid driver's license or by a current real estate tax bill. Only those immediate family members and care givers living at your residence will be eligible for family rates. (See guidelines below.)

All season pass holders are required to have a photo identification card, issued by Vernon Township. **If you cannot present this card to the pool attendant at the time of check-in, you will be charged the daily user rate.**

Through the season, pool pass photos are taken at the Vernon Township Administrative Center, Monday - Friday, 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. **For your convenience, additional pool pass photo hours are as follows:**

**May 1, 2007 to June 15, 2007**  
**Tuesdays and Thursdays - 8:30 a.m. - 8:00 p.m.**  
**Saturdays 9:00 a.m. - Noon.**



**Individuals must be present for their pass photo. We will not take a picture of a photo brought in by another person. Vernon Township will NOT give credit towards the purchase of a pool pass for any daily fees paid.**

## Pass Guidelines

- Admission to the pool requires payment of a daily admission fee or a pool pass, regardless of age.
- A pool pass must be presented upon check-in at the pool. If you can not present the card at the time of check-in, you will be charged the daily user rate. Lifeguards can not issue pool passes at the pool and will not accept any other form of identification for admission into the pool.
- Pool passes are NOT transferable.
- Passes are not refundable.
- Only immediate family members living in your residence are eligible for family rates. Nannies and live-in baby sitters can be included, but must provide proof of residency at your address. Live out nannies and baby sitters must purchase an individual pass or purchase a daily pass.
- Replacement passes are \$5.00
- All passes are property of Vernon Township and can be suspended or revoked at any time.
- Passes used fraudulently or false information on the registration form may result in all of your family passes being revoked with no refund.
- For purposes of daily fees, adults are those individuals ages 16 and up.
- A responsible adult over the age of 16 must accompany children ages 8 and below.

**The above is only a partial list of pool guidelines. Vernon Township has the authority to enforce additional guidelines.**

**Attention:** Due to circumstances beyond our control, it might be necessary for everyone to come in for a new pool pass photo. Thank you for your understanding.
